Sistani, for granting us permission, via our UK charity partner, Hasnain Foundation (Registered Charity No. 328234), to utilise khumus funds (specifically sahm imam) for the benefit of poor Shia Muslim children and young people in Moshi, Tanzania.

In the last 12 months, Hasnain Foundation, received £32,000 of khumus funds of which £16,000 (sahm sadat) has been transferred to Imam Ali Foundation, and £16,000 (sahm imam) has been retained and allocated to Kijana Kwanza in Tanzania.

Attached to this letter is a brief report of our work and activities, case studies of some of our students supported and a financial statement of how the funds have been expended.

The stories of these children and young people, some of whom are converts to Shia Islam, present a compelling case for continuing our work in challenging poverty and disadvantage in one of the poorest countries in the world. Sadly, there are many more Shia Muslim children and young people in need of our support, but without on-going authorisation to collect *khumus* funds, we are unable to meet new and emerging community needs.
