




Funding Received

In the year 1 June 2020 to 31 May 2021, Hasnain Foundation received £16,000 in *Sahm Imam* funds and £16,000 in *Sahm Sadat* funds. The latter was transferred to Imam Ali Foundation as per our *ijaza* (permission agreement) from the offices of Ayatullah Sayyid Ali Sistani.

All *Sahm Imam* funds have been allocated via our partner, Kijana Kwanza, to support students undertake vocational training across a variety of disciplines, attend mandatory work placements for their qualifications and access emergency healthcare.

Abulrazack is an intelligent young man who was raised in a Shia Muslim family. Although he did well in his secondary education, he was not able to go to university because his application for a government loan was rejected. After working as a farmer and labourer, he was selected for sponsorship. In the future, he plans to work in a medical clinic.

Hassani was brought up in a Shia Muslim family and performed well in his studies. But the death of his father disrupted his education, and he was not able to proceed without a sponsor. He used to work as a water seller, until he was selected for sponsorship. In the future, he plans to open his own pharmacy.

Kassim is a convert to Shia Islam from Christianity. He was orphaned as a child and was initially supported by his extended family until he became seriously unwell whilst at university, forcing him to abandon his studies. During his rehabilitation he became fascinated by Islam and joined hawza (Islamic Seminary) in Kikavu Village, Kilimanjaro Region, Tanzania. After his recovery, the local Sheikh encouraged him to continue his education. When he finishes his diploma, he plans on setting up an electronic repair shop.

Although Hussen is an intelligent boy, his education was disrupted because his father was unwilling to support his education beyond primary school. Hussen left home to find work and travelled widely. He converted to Shia Islam whilst in Arusha but was rejected by his father and extended family. He is now sponsored to undertake the Qualifying Test, which is a shortened version of secondary education. His goal is to study medicine at university and serve the local community.
